I have to be honest; I have read most of Vipin's series books, and although the series is a complexed read, I was always able to flow through the pages. I can't say I was able to do the same in "What is Trading Factor" by Vipin Gupta. All through his series, Vipin Gupta includes values to the elements' components of the Universal concept he is presenting. These components interact through trade, producing another component on the next interactive level. At least, this is the understanding I have gotten from my reading. In this book, Gupta goes into the nitty gritty of this mathematical interaction, where numerical values get traded.
